### Digital Drawing

Drawing, primarily from location, participants will expand their knowledge - using traditional drawn marks to incorporate of computer aided marks working with computer programs such as Photoshop and Painter.

This two day workshop is designed to stimulate and inspire new ways of manipulating your existing approach to drawing by merging tradition and technology, the known and unknown.

The computer will become another **drawing tool** allowing a fast approach and response to drawing as a process; expanding ideas and possibilities for composition colour, and new ranges of marks.

Experimenting with new media will lead to the fusion of different approaches and allow for the drawn image to be manipulated at any stage of the processes used and developed over the two days. Transferring ideas and techniques explored digitally onto paper and the manipulation of related photographic images will also be investigated.



Digitally, brushes can be designed, paint thrown, drawing effects created, images repeated and scale manipulated all within minutes, this in turn makes digital drawing a valuable tool in the process of existing ideas.

The workshop will be led by Sylvia Reitzema, a graduate of the MA in Drawing as Process who works, lectures and exhibits in Mallorca. Sylvia has run several workshops previously at Kingston University and at the Stanley Picker Gallery. Her work is strongly involved in, and influenced greatly by the interaction of traditional drawing materials and the application and integration of digital drawing.
