Rietveld Arsenale

The One Minutes foundation will show The One Minutes Train: videos of landscapes passing by, shot through the window of a moving train. A journey through 30 countries. The journey starts with a one minute in Italy, then on to Switzerland, the Netherlands, Russia, China, India and America before returning to Europe. The installation consists of 20 monitors in line; moving landscapes. A total of around 280 videos of 30 artists has been selected for this installation.

Dr Eugenia Fratreskou lectures at the MA Architecture & Digital Media, University of Westminster and has been a visiting critic for MA Architecture & Urbanism, Architectural Association School of Architecture, London. Memberships include: Leonardo Reviews Panel (ISAST/MIT), Art & Science Collaborations Inc (NYC), Drawing Research Network, Centre for Recent Drawing etc. Fratreskou has gained an AHRC-funded PhD (March 2006) for creating new types of digital site-specific art, an AHRC-funded MA in Drawing and a BA (Hons) in Painting (University of Surrey/Wimbledon School of Art, London). Her research leadership and contributions have included international interdisciplinary conferences, exhibitions, research events and publications with the *Un-built 2008* international architecture research programme (Athens Byzantine & Christian Museum/SARCHA), NY Digital Salon, Slade School of Fine Art, Venice Biennale, CADE, MARCEL etc. She has gained Awards of Excellence by the Greek Government and Chelsea College of Art & Design.
